RECOMMENDATION: Approve and Pass Resolution NO. 241-2020.

DISCUSSION: The septic tank at 1120 Pennsylvania failed, requiring a connection to the City's sewer system. Due to the property being contiguous with the City's corporate boundary, the owners of 1120 East Pennsylvania, Laura and Shawn Berry, have agreed to voluntary annexation of the property, in order to receive City services. The owners have also waived their right to withdraw within three days of this public hearing on their application.

As in any annexation case, the property will be annexed into the City with an AG District zoning, and will be subsequently rezoned appropriate to its current use and consistent with the City's Future Land Use Map and Plan, once it is within the City's corporate boundary. The property is 4.53 acres and has a current tax assessed value of \$126,740. Net taxable value is currently \$69,801. Building value currently stands at \$91,560, with land value at \$35,180.







#### A RESOLUTION BY THE OTTUMWA CITY COUNCIL ASSESSING 2020 WEED MOWING CHARGES AGAINST CERTAIN LOTS IN THE CITY OF OTTUMWA, IOWA.

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 24-6(c) of the Municipal Code of the City of Ottumwa, Iowa, public notice was given to property owners of the City to cut or destroy any weeds, vines, brush and dead, damaged or unsightly bushes, trees or other offensive growth; and

WHEREAS, upon the failure of the property owner to cut or destroy said growth, the City caused the same to be done by the City of Ottumwa's weed mowing contractor for calendar year 2020, and said costs to be assessed to the owner or owners of the lot or parcel of ground; and

WHEREAS, the Code of Iowa, Section 364.12, allows the City Council to assess costs of abating nuisances against real estate taxes in the same manner as the property tax, and in accordance with Section 24-6(c) of the Ottumwa Municipal Code, said costs and expenses associated with the cutting of weeds are to be assessed against the owner of said lots or parcels; and

WHEREAS, said costs for the mowing of weeds, vines, etc., for calendar year 2020 are attached and made a part of this resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the attached 2020 weed mowing charges be assessed against the respective properties and the City Clerk to certify said assessments to the County Treasurer to be collected on the tax rolls.

Purpose: Resolution fixing date for a meeting on the authorization of a loan agreement and the issuance of not to exceed \$3,500,000 General Obligation Capital Loan Notes of the City of Ottumwa, State of Iowa (for essential corporate purposes), and providing for publication of notice.

Recommendation: Pass and Adopt Resolution No. 262-2020.

Discussion: A public hearing is required by law prior to the issuance of G.O. Debt. We're asking the Council to take additional action for the authorization of a Loan Agreement and the issuance of not to exceed \$3,500,000 General Obligation Capital Loan Notes. ECP-4 will be combined with ECP-1 GO Capital Loan Note not to exceed \$6,000,000. Principal and interest on the proposed Loan Agreement will be payable from the Debt Service Fund.

The debt will be for essential corporate purposes, to provide funds to pay the costs of equipping the police and fire departments; the acquisition, restoration, or demolition of abandoned, dilapidated, or dangerous buildings, structures or properties; the construction, reconstruction, and repairing of any street and levee improvements, the acquisition, installation, and repair of sidewalks, storm sewers, sanitary sewers, water service lines, street lighting, and traffic control devices, including the acquisition of any real estate needed for any of the foregoing purposes and the removal or replacement of dead or diseased trees; the reconstruction extension and improvement of the airport; the rehabilitation and improvements of City parks, including facilities, equipment and improvements commonly found in City parks; and refinancing and refunding certain outstanding indebtedness of the City, including the Taxable General Obligation Bonds, Series 2011 dated October 19, 2011.

RESOLUTION FIXING DATE FOR A MEETING ON THE AUTHORIZATION OF A LOAN AGREEMENT AND THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED \$3,500,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION CAPITAL LOAN NOTES OF THE CITY OF OTTUMWA, STATE OF IOWA (FOR ESSENTIAL CORPORATE PURPOSES), AND PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION OF NOTICE THEREOF

WHEREAS, it is deemed necessary and advisable that the City of Ottumwa, State of Iowa, should provide for the authorization of a Loan Agreement and issuance of General Obligation Capital Loan Notes, to the amount of not to exceed \$3,500,000, as authorized by Sections 384.24A and 384.25, of the Code of Iowa, for the purpose of providing funds to pay costs of carrying out essential corporate purpose project(s) as hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, the Loan Agreement and Notes shall be payable from the Debt Service Fund; and

WHEREAS, before a Loan Agreement may be authorized and General Obligation Capital Loan Notes, issued to evidence the obligation of the City thereunder, it is necessary to comply with the provisions of the Code of Iowa, as amended, and to publish a notice of the proposal and of the time and place of the meeting at which the Council proposes to take action for the authorization of the Loan Agreement and Notes and to receive oral and/or written objections from any resident or property owner of the City to such action.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF CITY OF OTTUMWA, STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. That this Council meet in the Council Chambers, City Hall, 105 East 3rd Street, Ottumwa, Iowa, at 5:30 P.M., on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2020, for the purpose of taking action on the matter of the authorization of a Loan Agreement and issuance of not to exceed \$3,500,000 General Obligation Capital Loan Notes, for essential corporate purposes, the proceeds of which notes will be used to provide funds to pay the costs of equipping the police and fire departments; the acquisition, restoration, or demolition of abandoned, dilapidated, or dangerous buildings, structures or properties; the construction, reconstruction, and repairing of any street, bridge and levee improvements, the acquisition, installation, and repair of sidewalks, storm sewers, sanitary sewers, water service lines, street lighting, and traffic control devices, including the acquisition of any real estate needed for any of the foregoing purposes and the removal or replacement of dead or diseased trees; the reconstruction extension and improvement of the airport; the rehabilitation and improvements of City parks, including facilities, equipment and improvements commonly found in City parks; and refinancing and refunding certain outstanding indebtedness of the City, including the Taxable General Obligation Bonds, Series 2011 dated October 19, 2011.

Section 2. To the extent any of the projects or activities described in this resolution may be reasonably construed to be included in more than one classification under Division III of Chapter 384 of the Code of Iowa, the Council hereby elects the "essential corporate purpose" classification and procedure with respect to each such project or activity, pursuant to Section 384.28 of the Code of Iowa.

Section 3. The Clerk is authorized and directed to proceed on behalf of the City with the negotiation of terms of a Loan Agreement and the issuance of General Obligation Capital Loan Notes, evidencing the City's obligations to a principal amount of not to exceed \$3,500,000, to select a date for the final approval thereof, to cause to be prepared such notice and sale information as may appear appropriate, to publish and distribute the same on behalf of the City and this Council and otherwise to take all action necessary to permit the completion of a loan on a basis favorable to the City and acceptable to the Council.

Section 4. That the Clerk is hereby directed to cause at least one publication to be made of a notice of the meeting, in a legal newspaper, printed wholly in the English language, published at least once weekly, and having general circulation in the City. The publication to be not less than four clear days nor more than twenty days before the date of the public meeting on the issuance of the Notes.
