OTTUMWA CITY COUNCIL MINUTES

REGULAR MEETING NO. 11 Council Chambers, City Hall April 6, 2021 5:30 O'Clock P.M.

The meeting convened at 5:36 P.M.

Present were Council Member Meyers, Berg, Dalbey, Roe, Stevens and Mayor Lazio.

Meyers moved, seconded by Berg to approve the following consent agenda items: Mins. from Regular Mtg. No. 9 on Mar 16, 2021 and Special Mtg. No. 10 on Mar 30, 2021 as presented; Civil Service Commission Eligibility List for Mar 25, 2021 – Police Officer Entrance; Approve appointment of Barbara Codjoe to full-time Dir, of Human Resources effective on or before April 12, 2021; Approve appointment of Rodney ReQuena to full-time Police Officer effective on or about April 19, 2021; Approve appointment of Chase Crandall to probationary firefighter; Approve pymt. to Computer Information Systems, Inc. in the amount of \$19,831 for a one-year License Ren. & Maint. Agt. for the Police Dept. in-house computer software; Approve replacement of Air Conditioning and Furnace Units in the Public Works Bldg. for \$14,000; Consideration of Ack./Settlement Agt. between City of Ottumwa and MAD JuSTus LLC d/b/a Mad Ave. Quick Shop (405 S. Madison St.); Consideration of Ack./Settlement Agt. between City of Ottumwa and Casey's Marketing Company d/b/a Casey's Gen. Store #2208 (1603) W. Second); Consideration of Ack./Settlement Agt. between City of Ottumwa and Hy-Vee, Inc. d/b/a Hy-Vee Gas #1 (1027 N. Quincy); Approve Salvage Dealer's License renewals for: Rosenman's Inc., 902 E. Main St.; Karz Salvage LLC, 430 N. Forrest Ave.; Courtney Car Crushing & Scrap, 825 Hayne St.; Alter Metal Recycling, 404 N. Forrest Ave.; all applications pending final inspections; Res. No. 79-2021, auth. renewal and admin, services agt, with Wellmark Blue Cross and Blue Shield of IA for hlth, and dental ins., for July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022; Avesis, a Guardian Comp., for vision ins., for July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022; and Symetra Life Insurance Comp. for life ins., for July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2023; Res. No. 80-2021, auth. all budgeted trsfrs. for FY 2021 as presented by the Finance Dept.; Beer and/or liquor applications for: Pizza Hut 1, 1247 Theater Dr.; Las Palmas Bar & Grill, Inc., 321 E. Second St.; all applications pending final inspections; Consideration of Ack./Settlement Agt. between City of Ottumwa and Elliott Oil Comp. d/b/a BP (720 Richmond). All ayes.

Roe moved, seconded by Meyers to approve the agenda as presented with the removal of Item G-9, Ord. No. 3181-2021, that will be presented during the next regularly scheduled mtg., to be held April 20, 2021. All ayes.

City Admin. Rath reported Make Ottumwa Shine will be held May 16-22; would like to hold work session on April 27 to discuss code enforcement.

He also reported meeting with a group of citizens twice a month, discussing bringing back a local Human Rights Commission. This group wants to have a positive effect on the community; like to bring something before council in June.

Mayor Lazio inquired if there was anyone from the audience who wished to address an item on the agenda. There were none.

Roe moved, seconded by Dalbey to authorize City staff to work with Anderson, Larkin & CO on the FY21 audit. All ayes.

This was the time, place and date set for a public hearing approving the plans, specs., form of contract and est. cost for the Rehabilitate Runway 4/22 for the Ottumwa Reg. Airport Project. Airport Mgr. Cobler

reported this project will be completely funded by the FAA, which explains the quick turnaround. Bid opening will be 4/27/2021. No objections were recd. Meyers moved, seconded by Dalbey to close the public hearing. All ayes.

Meyers moved, seconded by Roe that Res. No. 67-2021, approving the plans, specs., form of contract and est. cost for the Rehabilitate Runway 4/22 for the Ottumwa Reg. Airport Project, be passed and adopted. All ayes.

This was the time, place and date set for a public hearing on the option to consider a Renewal of Lease Agt. between the City of Ottumwa and IA Dept. of Admin. Services for the CASA Program and lease of office space in City Hall bldg. located at 105 E. Third St. The IA Dept. of Inspections and Appeals, Child Advocacy Brd. and the CASA Program has been operating out of rooms 300 and 301 at City Hall. Rent was increased to \$224/month to reflect a cost of living adjustment since the previous Agt. The lease runs from July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2024. No objections were recd. Dalbey moved, seconded by Berg to close the public hearing. All ayes.

Meyers moved, seconded by Roe that Res. No. 68-2021, approving the Renewal of Lease Agt. between the City of Ottumwa and IA Dept. of Admin. Services for the IA Dept. of Inspections and Appeals, Child Advocacy Brd. and the CASA Program and auth. the Mayor to sign, be passed and adopted. All ayes.

This was the time, place and date set for a public hearing approving the plans, specs., form of contract and est. cost for the 2021 Sidewalk Drop and Detectable Warning Installation Program. PW Dir. Seals reported this is the 10th contract for this program; completion of these sidewalk drops and detectable warnings will be a step towards compliance with the ADA Transition Plan that was approved by Council on 8/7/2012. The City owned and maintained intersections are one portion of the ADA requirements. The overall project was est. at \$1,280,000 and is budgeted for \$120,000 each yr. until complete. Total cost to date \$962,695.78. No objections were recd. Dalbey moved, seconded by Roe to close the public hearing. All ayes.

Berg moved, seconded by Roe that Res. No. 72-2021, approving the plans, specs., form of contract and est. cost for the 2021 Sidewalk Drop and Detectable Warning Installation Program, be passed and adopted. All ayes.

This was the time, place and date set for a public hearing approving the plans, specs., form of contract and est. cost for the 2021 Catch Basin Replacement Program. PW Dir. Seals reported this is our annual catch basin project and will reconstruct and raise catch basin wells with new grates as indicated in plans and specs. Budgeted amount \$50,000. No objections were recd. Roe moved, seconded by Dalbey to close the public hearing. All ayes.

Meyers moved, seconded by Dalbey that Res. No. 73-2021, approving the plans, specs., form of contract and est. cost for the 2021 Catch Basin Replacement Program, be passed and adopted. All ayes.

This was the time, place and date set for a public hearing approving the plans, specs., form of contract and est. cost for the 2021 Sanitary Utility Access Program. PW Dir. Seals reported this annual project places sanitary utility access in existing sanitary sewer lines and associated patch work. Manholes will be placed at locations that have either limited access points or problem areas prone to plugging causing increased cleaning maint. No objections were recd. Dalbey moved, seconded by Berg to close the public hearing. All ayes.

Roe moved, seconded by Berg that Res. No. 74-2021, approving the plans, specs., form of contract and est. cost for the 2021 Sanitary Utility Access Program, be passed and adopted. All ayes.

This was the time, place and date set for a public hearing approving the plans, specs., form of contract and est. cost for the River Wall Extension Project. PW Dir. Seals reported this project will raise the north side river wall between the Hydro Dam and Wapello St. Bridge by one foot. This project is necessary for the river wall to meet FEMA's freeboard requirements. The length of the wall is 1,350 LF. No objections were recd. Dalbey moved, seconded by Meyers to close the public hearing. All ayes.

Meyers moved, seconded by Dalbey that Res. No. 75-2021, approving the plans, specs., form of contract and est. cost for the River Wall Extension Project, be passed and adopted. All ayes.

This was the time, place and date set for a public hearing on the matter, the Ottumwa City Council finds that based upon evidence submitted by the City Attorney's Office, on Feb. 3, 2021, an employee of BW Gas & Convenience Retail d/b/a Yesway #1030, committed a violation of IA Code section 453A.2(1), by selling, giving, or otherwise supplying any tobacco, tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, vapor products, or cigarettes to any person under twenty-one yrs. of age and that this was a first violation of this statute. Attorney Stone reported on this item. No objections were recd. Meyers moved, seconded by Dalbey to close the public hearing. All ayes.

Roe moved, seconded by Dalbey that Res. No. 81-2021, order assessing penalty, 1st Violation, to BW Gas & Convenience Retail d/b/a Yesway #1030, to remit three hundred dollars (\$300.00) to the City on or before May 6, 2021 (30 days from the date of this Order), for the first violation of IA Code section 453A.2(1); failure to pay the civil penalty by this date shall automatically result in the suspension of the cigarette permit for a period of fourteen (14) days in addition to the \$300 fine. All ayes.

Dalbey moved, seconded by Berg that Res. No. 69-2021, removing a special assessment for delinquent sewer fees applied to 1653 S. Milner St on Res. No. 107-2020, be passed and adopted. \$577.87 in delinquent sewer fees will be removed from property taxes. All ayes.

Roe moved, seconded by Berg that Res. No. 70-2021, removing a special assessment for delinquent refuse fees applied to 1653 S. Milner St. on Res. No. 108-2020, be passed and adopted. \$274.09 in delinquent refuse fees will be removed from property taxes. All ayes.

Meyers moved, seconded by Roe that Res. No. 71-2021, addressing a Notice of Assignment of Contract Funds and Auth. the Mayor to sign Letter of Ack. on the Johnson Ave. Reconstruction Project, be passed and adopted. PW Dir. Seals reported this contract was awarded to Pillar, Inc., in the amount of \$109,935.20 on Feb. 16, 2021; a letter from Northern Escrow, Inc. was recd requesting assignment of contract funds due Pillar, Inc. for work completed on said project. All ayes.

Dalbey moved, seconded by Meyers that Res. No. 76-2021, award the contract for the 2021 RFP#3, Eisenhower Pedestrian Bridge Repair to Boulder Contracting, LLC of Grundy Center, IA, in the amount of \$85,500, be passed and adopted. PW Dir. Seals reported three bids were recd on Mar. 24, 2021; question asked if this is solely a city obligation or if the Ottumwa School District was able to assist. Seals stated, the school didn't feel like this was part of their capital responsibility. Vote Taken Ayes: Meyers, Berg, Dalbey, Stevens. Nays: Roe. Motion carried 4-1.

Dalbey moved, seconded by Berg that Res. No. 77-2021, approving the Pro. Services Agt. between City of Ottumwa and Willett Hofmann & Assoc., Inc. for the 2021 City Hall Improvements Project and authorize the Mayor to sign the Agt., be passed and adopted. PW Dir. Seals reported Willett Hofmann &

Assoc., Inc. will provide architectural and engineering services in assoc. with City Hall Improvements Project. The scope of work initially includes schematic design to evaluate HVAC options and the impact to City Hall interior finishes and operations. A review committee was est. consisting of four staff members along with Councilman Roe. Responses recd from 16 different firms on 2/25/21; narrowed down to 3 firms for interview based upon scores from the review committee. The various options and cost opinions will be presented to the City Council by representatives of Willett Hofmann at a June 2021 mtg. so a formal direction can be decided. Compensation is \$42,500 to complete the schematic design. Council person Berg asked if this firm is in the Technical Advisory Network through State Historical Society; to apply for architectural design work grants, the architects must be in the network. All ayes.

Roe moved, seconded by Dalbey that Res No. 78-2021, approving Change Order No. 1 and accepting the work as final and complete for the Fox Sauk & North Court Intersection Project, be passed and adopted. PW Dir. Seals reported CO#1 decreases contract by \$7,522.50 for qty adj., total contract sum \$143,572.50. USDA Rural Business Development Grant recd. for \$142,347. All ayes.

Mayor Lazio inquired if anyone from the audience wished to address an item not on the agenda. John Fenner, 407 Elmdale Ave. discussed the lack of a men's shelter in Ottumwa. My son has been in/out of jail due to addiction problems; needs someplace to go during his transition out of jail; local, state, federal assistance – not sure where to go for help.

Councilman Roe brought up Senate Bill 587, which could be damaging to cities and counties as it takes local control away from them as it relates to commercial and industrial property tax replacement pymts. and other specified tax provisions; urge anyone listening to write a letter to your state senator or rep. opposing this bill.

There being no further business, Roe moved, seconded by Dalbey that the meeting adjourn. All ayes.

This Subaward Recipient Agreement is effective September 21, 2020, by and between Ottumwa Iowa Police Department and the Iowa Department of Public Safety.

Purpose

The Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS) has awarded National Crime Statistic Exchange (NCS-X) funding to federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies to improve incident-based crime reporting and national crime statistics. As part of this initiative, the lowa Department of Public Safety (DPS) has received funding to develop a new state crime repository for award 2019-FU-CX-K014. DPS has made the unobligated balance of grant funds available to law enforcement agencies for the sole purpose of updating local agency records management systems to conform to the new lowa UCR technical specification.

Scope of Service

The services carried out under this agreement shall be consistent with those contained in the agency UCR Technical Specification Subaward Application and approved by DPS. As stated in the application, Ottumwa Iowa Police Department shall implement changes to the local records management system (RMS) and achieve certification by the Iowa UCR program. Certification is achieved once an agency submits three consecutive months of crime data in the new technical specification with an error rate of less than four (4) percent for each month. Any changes to the agency timeline must be communicated to the UCR Program Manager. All requirements must be met no later than September 30, 2021.

Reprogramming of Funds

Reprogramming of funds is not allowable under the Subaward Recipient Agreement.

Requirement to Report Potentially Duplicative Funding

If Ottumwa lowa Police Department currently has other active awards of federal funds, or if Ottumwa lowa Police Department receives any other award of federal funds during the period of performance for this award, Ottumwa lowa Police Department promptly must determine whether funds from any of those other federal awards have been, are being, or are to be used (in whole or in part) for one or more of the identical cost items for which funds are provided under this award. If so, the Ottumwa lowa Police Department must promptly notify the DPS in writing of the potential duplication, and, if so requested by the DPS or by the BJS, must seek a budget-modification or change-of-project-scope grant adjustment notice (GAN) to eliminate any inappropriate duplication of funding.

Supportive documentation shall consist of proof of payment.

Reporting Requirements

All participants may be required to prepare a final report of their agency's expenditures, which shall be submitted to the UCR Program Manager within 30 days of close of the program fiscal year. Failure to submit reports on a timely basis may result in the interruption or termination of the initiative funding for your agency.

Program Standards

Each agency agrees to abide by the policies established by the state UCR program, including timely submission of crime data as outlined in Lowa Code § 692.15 Updated program policy will be furnished to each participant.

Assurances

Each agency agrees to abide by the terms and conditions set out in U.S. Department of Justice Certified Standard Assurances (Appendix A) and U.S. Department of Justice Certifications regarding Lobbying, Debarment, Suspension and Other Responsibility Matters; Drug Free Work Place Requirements; Federal Debt Status and Nondiscrimination Statutes and Implementing Regulations (Appendix B). Each agency will also submit a signed OMB form, Disclosure of Lobbying Activities (Appendix C).

Dear Mr. Rath and Dr. Thompson:

This waiver letter confirms that our Firm has been asked to represent the City of Ottumwa with respect to the preparation of an Airport Lease Agreement with Indian Hills Community College.

As you know, our Firm has existing client relationships with the City of Ottumwa and Indian Hills Community College. Given the proposed concurrent representation of the Parties, we cannot undertake a representation where we will advocate or negotiate for one party against the other. However, our ethical rules allow us to undertake representation of both parties to a transaction provided that we can competently and diligently represent each client, and each client provided informed consent in writing to the representation.

We believe that we can competently and diligently represent both the City of Ottumwa and Indian Hills Community College in the limited role of memorializing an Airport Lease Agreement as determined by the Parties. The City of Ottumwa and Indian Hills Community College must determine the terms to include in the Agreement (between you) and then provide such terms to us to include in the Agreement. In our limited role as the scrivener, the more details you work out between you and provide to us, the better. In the course of drafting we may identify categories of essential terms you have not addressed, in which case we will suggest that both parties coordinate and let us know what specific terms you mutually agree on for each such category. We may also include stock or customary terms in the draft we provide with no intent of favoring either party over the other. Any such terms may be rejected or modified by either of you and, as with all terms in the Agreement, are subject to mutual agreement between you and can be revised by you. Through the proposed limited joint representation, we can assist you in documenting the Agreement you reach on an amicable and mutually advantageous basis.

In the event there are actual disagreements of substance or content between the Parties, we will decline to advise either party with respect to such issue. Should an issue arise for which the Parties cannot reach agreement on your own, we would need to withdraw from further representation of both Parties with respect to the proposed Agreement. Such withdrawal would

not, however, impact our on-going representation of the City of Ottumwa or Indian Hills Community College on all other matters.

In the course of the joint representation of the Agreement, we will not have communications with one party relevant to the Agreement that are confidential from the other. For matters relevant to this limited joint representation, we have a legal and ethical duty to share with both of you the information we receive and the comments that we give. In other words, your conversations with us with respect to the Agreement are not privileged as between the two of you and could not be claimed as privileged should any dispute arise between you. If you want independent advice concerning the terms of the Agreement, or if you wish to be able to discuss matters in complete privacy, you will need to seek such advice from alternate counsel.

In deciding whether or not to consent to the joint representation, the Parties should consider how our limited representation as described above could or may affect them. For example, clients that are asked to consent to conflicts should consider whether there is any material risk that their attorney will be less diligent on their behalf due to the conflict. Similarly, clients should consider whether there is any material risk that their confidential information or other proprietary matters will be used adversely to them due to the conflict. We do not believe that our obligations of loyalty and confidentiality to any party will impair our ability to represent the Parties in this matter in the limited manner described herein, but of course you may ask us any questions you may have regarding the contents of this letter and/or seek the independent advice of a lawyer outside of our Firm regarding the contents of this letter.

Please respond to this request by either signing and returning this letter or informing us that you decline to approve and consent to this joint representation. We will only be able to represent the Parties in this matter if both Parties are in agreement regarding this limited representation.





It is understood and agreed:

The Contractor shall commence removal within such time and work continuously as to be completed by the date indicated in this contract. The Contractor shall forfeit \$250.00 per working day required to complete the contract after the aforesaid completion date. A working day as used herein, shall be defined as any calendar day, exclusive of Saturdays, Sundays, or a recognized legal holiday, or on which weather or other conditions (not under the control of the Contractor) will permit the removal operations to proceed for not less 3/4 of a normal work day in the performance of a controlling item of work.

An extension of the contract period may be granted by the Director for additional work requiring additional removal time. An extension may also be granted by the Director for inclement weather or Acts of God that interfere with the Contractor's ability to work.

AGREEMENT

THIS IS AN AGREEMENT effective as of April 20 , 2021 ("Effective Date") between the City of Ottumwa Iowa ("City") and Calhoun-Burns and Associates, Inc., West Des Moines, Iowa ("Engineer"). Engineer agrees to provide the services described below to City for 2021 and 2022 bridge inspection and load rating in the City of Ottumwa, Iowa ("Assignment").

Description of Engineer's Services:

- Routine inspection of three (3) bridges for 2021 Attachment A
- Routine inspection of eight (8) bridges for 2022 Attachment B
- Includes update of the load rating calculations if necessary
- . Includes update of the scour evaluation if necessary; does not include level C scour
- Includes entry of inspection data and approvals in Iowa DOT Structural Inventory and Inspection Management System (SIIMS) where required.
- Work will be in accordance with Iowa Department of Transportation and Federal Highway Administration guidelines and requirements.

City and Engineer further agree as follows:

1.01 Basic Agreement

A. Engineer shall provide, or cause to be provided, the services set forth in this Agreement, and City shall pay Engineer for such Services as set forth in Paragraph 9.01.

2.01 Payment Procedures

- A. Preparation of Invoices. Engineer will prepare a monthly invoice in accordance with Engineer's standard invoicing practices and submit the invoice to City.
- B. Payment of Invoices. Invoices are due and payable within 30 days of receipt. If City fails to make any payment due Engineer for services and expenses within 30 days after receipt of Engineer's invoice, Engineer may, without liability, after giving seven days written notice to City, suspend services under this Agreement until Engineer has been paid in full all amounts due for services, expenses, and other related charges.

3.01 Additional Services

- A. If authorized by City, or if required because of changes in the Assignment, Engineer shall furnish services in addition to those set forth above.
- B. City shall pay Engineer for such additional services as follows: For additional services of Engineer's employees engaged directly on the Assignment an amount equal to the cumulative hours charged to the Assignment by each class of Engineer's employees times standard hourly rates for each applicable billing class; plus reimbursable expenses and Engineer's consultants' charges, if any.

4.01 Termination

A. The obligation to provide further services under this Agreement may be terminated:

1. For cause,

a. By either party upon 30 days written notice in the event of substantial failure by the other party to perform in accordance with the Agreement's terms through no fault of the terminating party.

b. By Engineer:

- upon seven days written notice if Engineer believes that Engineer is being requested by City to furnish or perform services contrary to Engineer's responsibilities as a licensed professional; or
- upon seven days written notice if the Engineer's services for the Assignment are delayed or suspended for more than 90 days for reasons beyond Engineer's control.
 - 3) Engineer shall have no liability to City on account of such termination.
- c. Notwithstanding the foregoing, this Agreement will not terminate as a result of a substantial failure under paragraph 4.01.A.1.a if the party receiving such notice begins, within seven days of receipt of such notice, to correct its failure and proceeds diligently to cure such failure within no more than 30 days of receipt of notice; provided, however, that if and to the extent such substantial failure cannot be reasonably cured within such 30 day period, and if such party has diligently attempted to cure the same and thereafter continues diligently to cure the same, then the cure period provided for herein shall extend up to, but in no case more than, 60 days after the date of receipt of the notice.
- 2. For convenience, by City effective upon the receipt of notice by Engineer.
- B. The terminating party under paragraphs 4.01.A.1 or 4.01.A.2 may set the effective date of termination at a time up to 30 days later than otherwise provided to allow Engineer to demobilize personnel and equipment, to complete tasks whose value would otherwise be lost, to prepare notes as to the status of completed and uncompleted tasks, and to assemble Assignment materials in orderly files.

5.01 Controlling Law

A. This Agreement is to be governed by the law of the State of Iowa.

6.01 Successors, Assigns, and Beneficiaries

A. City and Engineer each is hereby bound and the partners, successors, executors, administrators, and legal representatives of City and Engineer (and to the extent permitted by paragraph 6.01.B the assigns of City and Engineer) are hereby bound to the other party to this Agreement and to the partners, successors, executors, administrators, and legal representatives (and said assigns) of such other party, in respect of all covenants, agreements, and obligations of this Agreement.

B. Neither City nor Engineer may assign, sublet, or transfer any rights under or interest (including, but without limitation, moneys that are due or may become due) in this Agreement without the written consent of the other, except to the extent that any assignment, subletting, or transfer is mandated or restricted by law. Unless specifically stated to the contrary in any written consent to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any duty or responsibility under this Agreement.

7.01 General Considerations

- A. The standard of care for all professional engineering and related services performed or furnished by Engineer under this Agreement will be the care and skill ordinarily used by members of the subject profession practicing under similar circumstances at the same time and in the same locality. Engineer makes no warranties, express or implied, under this Agreement or otherwise, in connection with Engineer's services. Engineer and its Citys may use or rely upon the design services of others, including, but not limited to, contractors, manufacturers, and suppliers.
- B. All documents prepared or furnished by Engineer are instruments of service, and Engineer retains an ownership and property interest (including the copyright and the right of reuse) in such documents.
- C. To the fullest extent permitted by law, City and Engineer (1) waive against each other, and the other's employees, officers, directors, agents, insurers, partners, and Citys, any and all claims for or entitlement to special, incidental, indirect, or consequential damages arising out of, resulting from, or in any way related to the Assignment, and (2) agree that Engineer's total liability to City under this Agreement shall be limited to \$10,000.00 or the total amount of compensation received by Engineer, whichever is greater.
- D. The parties acknowledge that Engineer's scope of services does not include any services related to a Hazardous Environmental Condition (the presence of asbestos, PCBs, petroleum, hazardous substances or waste, and radioactive materials). If Engineer or any other party encounters a Hazardous Environmental Condition, Engineer may, at its option and without liability for consequential or any other damages, suspend performance of services on the portion of the Assignment affected thereby until City: (i) retains appropriate specialist Citys or contractors to identify and, as appropriate, abate, remediate, or remove the Hazardous Environmental Condition; and (ii) warrants that the Site is in full compliance with applicable Laws and Regulations.

8.01 Total Agreement

A. This Agreement (consisting of pages 1 to 5 inclusive together with any expressly incorporated attachment), constitutes the entire agreement between City and Engineer and supersedes all prior written or oral understandings. This Agreement may only be amended, supplemented, modified, or canceled by a duly executed written instrument.

DISCUSSION: Whether or not the City is successful in obtaining the Iowa's Rural Heritage

Revitalization Grant for the terra cotta and asbestos abatement at 131 E Main, there will be significant restoration work to still be completed by the developer that the City sells to. This grant will allow a preservation architect to complete a study of the property and prepare the necessary Historic Structure Report to guide that

developer in the complete rehabilitation of the property.

The application will request up to \$10 thousand to prepare the plan. The City would be required to provide matching funds up to \$5 thousand for a total of \$15 thousand. The City published an RFQ seeking qualified preservation architects to assist with the project. That RFQ closes April 28.

WHEREAS, a Historic Structure Report will guide the City in creating a development agreement with a property developer that ensures a historic rehabilitation of the property; and

WHEREAS, a Historic Property Report provides the necessary information to empower a property developer to budget for, finance and complete a historic rehabilitation; and

WHEREAS, the Iowa's Rural Heritage Revitalization Grant requires a 25% cash match which could be recovered by the sale of the building; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OTTUMWA, IOWA:

That the City of Ottumwa hereby authorizes the Planning Department to pursue a State Historical Society of Iowa Historic Resource Development Program Grant and authorizes the Mayor to sign the grant application.


I. Project Introduction

The City of Ottumwa seeks qualified preservation architects to develop a Historic Structure Report for the First National Bank Building at 131 E Main in Ottumwa, IA.

II. Project Location and Current Initiatives

The First National Bank Building stands proudly at the critical Market Street and Main Street intersection in Downtown Ottumwa. The property was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1995 with significance under Register Criteria C. Standing on a corner, the builders in 1915 made a profound statement with the neo-classical facade that covers not just the front of the building but wraps all the way around the corner for 132 feet along Market Street.

When the building was acquired by the City in late 2020, it was packed floor to ceiling with debris, tools, antiques, and rubbish. Since acquiring the building, the City has coordinated with volunteers from Main Street Ottumwa and the Historic Preservation Commission to clean out the building. In addition, this project, the City is pursuing an Iowa's Rural Heritage Revitalization Grant with the State Historic Preservation Office to stabilize terra cotta on the facade and begin asbestos abatement.





III. Project Description

The proposed project represents a critical first step in a multi-phase plan to revitalize the First National Bank building that sits prominently on the corner of Market and Main Streets in downtown Ottumwa. The City acquired title to the building following a legal action to claim abandoned property. They City sees itself as a temporary custodian of this important historic asset. In that role, we have a duty for the preservation of history and economic development of our downtown to set the property on a path to a historic redevelopment.

The proposed Historic Structure Report will guide the City in determining what improvements, if any, we should pursue before seeking to hand the property to its next owner to complete the redevelopment. The report will also provide the critical information necessary for the next owner to complete the revitalization in a manner that suits their intended use while meeting the standards of an appropriate historic redevelopment.

This project will proceed if funded and supported by a State Historical Society of Iowa Historic Resource Development Program (HRDP) Grant.



IV. Submission Requirements

All respondents wishing to receive consideration must submit, in writing, the following information:



- A detailed description of the project team, which includes descriptions and resume/background information for all principals and their proposed level of involvement. Minimum qualifications should be equivalent to the <u>required</u> <u>qualifications</u> for a Field Services Consultant with the State Historic Preservation Office Technical Assistance Network
- Demonstrated experience in delivering superior preservation planning and architectural work product, especially in the context of downtown buildings and Midwest small cities. Specific examples of similar projects are preferred.

V. Selection Process

The responses to the Request for Qualifications will be reviewed by a small committee of individuals that represent the City of Ottumwa, Main Street Ottumwa, and the Historic Preservation Commission. If necessary, the committee will select two to three finalists for an interview with the committee for further discussion. Interviews will take place using Microsoft Teams.
